

Veteran Directed Care (VDC) Program

For the past ten years, the Veteran Health Administration has been purchasing the consumer directed program, VDC, from No Wrong Door Systems in 35 states, DC and Puerto Rico.

➢ Veterans with nursing home level of care needs receive a flexible service budget that they control and can use to purchase goods and services from family, friends and neighbors.

➢ The VDC program offers Veterans the opportunity to design their care to fit their life in the community rather than making their life fit the existing service system.

NWD Medicaid Administrative Claiming

- Medicaid Administrative Claiming (aka Federal Financial Participation (FFP)) is a way in which Medicaid reimburses agencies doing work that supports Medicaid programs.
- Demonstrates the value of transformative work at the state level
 - Efficiently managing Medicaid programs by connecting individuals to various state/local resources that prevent Medicaid spend-down and promotes nursing home diversion
- FFP is one avenue for sustaining and supporting ADRC/NWD activities.



No Wrong Door System and Medicaid Administrative Claiming Reimbursement Guidance

The No Wrong Door (NWD) System represents a collaborative effort of the U.S. Administration for Community Living (ACL), the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), and the Veterans Health Administration (VHA), to support state efforts to streamline access to LTSS options for all populations and all payers. The state Medicaid agency is a critical partner and player within the NWD System conducting activities such as outreach, referral, assessment, functional and financial eligibility and even final determination which are all activities that are part of a state's NWD System. Federal matching funds under Medicaid are available for costs incurred by the state for administrative activities that directly support efforts to identify and enroll potential eligibles into Medicaid and that directly support the provision of medical services covered under the state Medicaid plan, when those activities are performed either directly by the state Medicaid agency or through contract or interagency agreement by another entity. The purpose of the <u>NWD System Medicaid Administrative Guidance</u> (PDF 982.27 KB) is to inform states about the appropriate methods for claiming federal matching funds, known as Federal Financial Participation (FFP), for Medicaid administrative activities performed through NWD Systems, and to ensure nonduplication for any such claims.
