

Area Agency on Aging (AAA) Performance Measures

Overview

One of NASUAD's members is interested in developing performance measures for its Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs). In order to learn more about other states' AAA performance measures, the state asked NASUAD to survey other states about their AAA performance measures.

NASUAD surveyed its members to learn which states have AAA performance measures in place and which states would be willing to share their AAA performance measures with other states. Twenty-six states responded to this inquiry, including: Arkansas, California, Colorado, Georgia, Idaho, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, New Jersey, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas, Utah, Virginia, Wyoming, and five unnamed states.

Response Summary

Of the 26 states that completed the survey, twelve states have AAA performance measures in place; and fourteen states do not have AAA performance measures in place. Among the twelve states with AAA performance measures in place, eleven states were willing to share their AAA performance measures with other states, including: Arkansas, Georgia, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, New Jersey, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Texas, and Wyoming.
