- For August 2018, CMS is reporting growth of 15,515,851 compared to July-September 2013. This figure is less than the 15,550,311 in net enrollment growth that was included in the Medicaid and CHIP: July 2018 Applications, Eligibility Determinations, and Enrollment Report by more than 34,000. This difference does not match the 19,382 decrease in the full report for the July to August 2018 period because the 19,382 figure is based on 51 states, while the 34,000 figure is based on only 49 states.
