Treatment of Individuals with Developmental Disabilities: Analysis Post-Katrina

- Save and manage individuals with developmental disabilities
- Their individual preferences not necessarily considered
- Opportunities to contribute in planning, response, and recovery activities by individuals with developmental disabilities episodic and extremely limited

What Needs to Happen

- Personal education and responsibility
- Participation in neighborhood activities
- Participation in community activities
- Representation on community-level planning groups
- Participation and representation at the State level

Neighborhood Ideas that Can Grow

- Find lists and share
- Have meetings to brainstorm
- Make "go kits"
- Make up contact numbers to carry
- What do you need to stay at home
- How do we help each other

Community Preparedness

- Influence notification procedures
- Influence "locate" process
- Checkout shelters, find out about needed stuff and put near or in shelters in advance
- Identify volunteers to help out in shelters
- Help design forms that make sense
- Know who to call for what
- Take neighborhood ideas to community planning meetings
- Expect/request public education and awareness activities
- Get everyone involved

State Level

- Share guidelines on plain language [use a "Google" search for a ton of resources – www.google.com]
- Appoint individuals with developmental disabilities to planning committees and advisory boards
- Use individuals with developmental disabilities during a disaster as advisors, advocates, mentors, and helpers
- Maintain up-to-date information on where resources are located
- Maintain up-to-date directories
- Encourage and sponsor drills on a regular basis
- Develop and sustain a public awareness campaign that lets people know what to do and where to go for help
- Encourage and support a decentralized, but connected, web of support that begins at the neighborhood level and expands to the state
- Take a functional approach to helping, based on universal design

Functional Approach to Preparing for and Helping People Based on Universal Design

- Ask questions that allow you to make decisions
- Ask the person the questions
- Ask questions only once
- Keep people where they land with people they know
- Create a routine
- Give lots of updates
- Give people something to do with their time
- Connect people with others who can help them plan and decide what they will do when they leave
- Mobilize resources to secure what people expect
