


### Several other features in addition to 150 core indicators helped:

- Individual waiver budget technology (DOORS) with good system architecture



#### Satisfaction with Home or Residence




### Satisfaction with Work/Daytime Activity




#### **Knows Their Case Manager or Service Coordinator**




### Case Manager/Service Coordinator Helps Meet Their Needs




#### Person has Input into IPC




■ Receives Information 45.8% (n=27)

■ Does Not Receive 27.10%(n=16)




### Choice of Direct Care Provider Family Survey



### Controls or Manages Hiring of Direct Care Workers






