## **Icons**

These are icons to use to describe the accessibility of an event.

Symbol	Description			
Accessible	The wheelchair symbol should only be used to indicate access for individuals with limited mobility, including wheelchair users. For example, the symbol is used to indicate an accessible entrance, bathroom or that a phone is lowered for wheelchair users.			
Blind/Low Vision	This symbol may be used to indicate access for people who are blind or have low vision, including: a guided tour, a path to a nature trail or a scent garden in a park; and a tactile tour or a museum exhibition that may be touched.			
Audio Description for TV, Video and Film	This service makes television, video, and film more accessible for persons who are blind or have low vision.			
Telephone Typewriter	Also known as text telephone (TT), or telecommunications device for the deaf (TDD), TTY indicates a telephone device used with the telephone (and the phone number) for communication between deaf, hard of hearing, speech-impaired and/or hearing persons.			
Sign Language Interpretation	The symbol indicates that Sign Language Interpretation is provided for a lecture, tour, performance, conference or other program.			
Assistive Listening Systems	These systems transmit sound via hearing aids or head sets.			
Closed Captioning	This symbol indicates that a television program or videotape is closed captioned for deaf or hard of hearing persons (and others).			
Braille	This symbol indicates that printed matter is available in Braille, including exhibition labeling, publications and signage.
