

Total FY2020 Budget \$72,236,900


The Department administers Medicaid HCBS programs, but the direct services are funded by the Medicaid department and are not reflected below.

## **Key State Initiative**

The Department of Aging and Independent Living is currently engaged in a project to redesign their long-term services and supports system. Key priorities for the project include:

- Assessment of the Department's current organizational structure;
- Analysis of performance measures for Area Agencies on Aging; and
- Business acumen training for AAAs.
