Organizational Structure


The director is appointed by the Governor and oversees a staff of 23 FTE.



Key State Initiative

Respite Voucher Program

The Respite Voucher Program offers vouchers that may be used to pay an in-home care agency, an Adult Day Center, or a private individual to provide respite care. Mississippi caregivers providing unpaid care for a dependent person of any age with a significant disability, or chronic illness requiring care are eligible to apply. Vouchers are provided in the amount of \$300.00 per household to approved family caregivers. Once approved the caregiver can reapply for repeat respite service after six months from the initial approval date. Caregivers can also apply for emergency respite in an emergency or unusual circumstance that is an unplanned situation that prevents the caregiver from providing the care required to the care recipient. Caregivers can apply by contacting a Mississippi Access to Care (MAC) Center and receiving assistance from a resource specialist. The MAC Center network is Mississippi's No Wrong Door for access to information, assistance, and person-centered counseling.
