Governor Holcomb, State of the State Address, Jan. 19, 2021

"Speaking of our elders, we're also working to ensure they can **choose** to age in an environment that best suits them, be it at home or in the comforts of a quality long-term care facility. We know **some 75% of people over 50 prefer to age in their own homes, yet only 45% of Hoosiers who qualify for Medicaid do** and must navigate a complex system of care to do so. Now is the time to put this effort in place, including a managed care system... to **integrate care** across the entire spectrum to make it **easier for families to navigate** and **drive outcomes** in a transparent and accountable way."



Government silos

→ The Objectives and Key Results (OKR) framework brings cross-sectional teams together in common purpose



Lack of communication and shared direction

→ OKRs foster structure for discussing progress and support needs



Fear of failure

- → OKRs push teams to achieve ambitious missions
- → OKRs offer regular opportunities to reflect on how to adapt for success

What is the OKR System?

Objectives and Key Results (OKR): collaborative goal-setting framework popularized by John Doerr in *Measure What Matters*



Advantages of OKRs

- Achieve ambitious missions
- Measurable results
- Facilitate communication and collaboration

Effective Objectives

- Meaningful
- Audacious
- Inspiring

Effective Key Results

- Specific & timebound
- Aggressive, yet realistic
- Measurable & verifiable

OKRs ≠ performance measures, project management, workplans

LTSS Reform Objectives & Key Results



The growing older adult population wants the option to age at home and deserves quality care in every setting



HOW

Overall Objective: 75% of new LTSS members will live and receive services in a home and community-based setting (HCBS)



- Faster eligibility
- Move to Indiana PathWays for Aging in 2024 (managed care LTSS program)
- Pay for outcomes, not transactions
- Integrate LTSS data systems
- Support the growth, retention and training of the HCBS direct service workforce
- Create Home Health Roadmap
- Integrate HCBS waivers






Using OKRs to Communicate How We are Transforming Our Aging System

- Hosted over 650 meetings with stakeholders including statewide roadshows since 2020
- Codesigned and procured Indiana PathWays for Aging program (managed care)
- Created the Indiana Direct Service Workforce Plan

- Active communication, outreach, and collaboration with our stakeholders: members, caregivers, providers, industry partners, community advocates
- Break out complex system into clear focus areas
- Sustain person-centered focus to help older adults age with choice, quality, & dignity across key result workstreams
